### 9. **NEW BUSINESS**

- 9.1. **Resolution 2024-18** A Resolution Awarding the Sale of General Obligation Temporary Improvement Bonds, Series 2024A—Nick Anhut, Ehlers, Inc.
  - Three Bids were received, ranging from 3.8565% to 4.1218%.
  - Piper Sandler & Co. had the lowest bid at 3.8565%.
    - This rate is lower than the 2023 planning estimates, which was 4.5%.
  - The schedule for the bond closing is for May 16<sup>th</sup>, 2024.

CS/CH Motion to Approve Resolution No. 2024-18, A Resolution Awarding the Sale of General Obligation Temporary Improvement Bonds, Series 2024A, in the Original Aggregate Principal Amount of \$3,925,00; Fixing Their Form and Specifications; Directing Their Execution and Delivery; and Providing for Their Payment. Motion passed 5-0.

- 9.2. **Resolution 2024-19** A Resolution Approving Plans and Specifications and Ordering Advertisement for Bids: Railroad Street Improvement Project—Josh Eckstein, Bolton & Menk, Inc.
  - Would allow the project to be advertised in April and bid in May.
  - Closing of the project is expected for Spring of 2025.

BA/CS Motion to approve Resolution 2024-19 Approving Plans and Specifications and Ordering Advertisement for Bids for the Railroad Street Improvement Project. Motion passed 5-0.

### 9.3. Resolution 2024-20 110 Main Street E. Variance—Hannah Ryback, WSB

- Currently, the lot contains a single-family home and a commercial building.
- A variance is necessary due to the parcel not having any frontage along a publicly dedicated street.
- The Planning Commission voted unanimously to recommend approval of the requested variance, subject to the following conditions.
  - The Applicant shall install a sewer and water service with a meter at the residence before recording the future lot split.
  - The Applicant shall remove the utility lines between the buildings following the new sewer and water connections to the residence.

CH/CS Motion to approve Resolution 2024-20; Approving a Variance to Create a Lot Without Frontage on a Public Street at 110 Main St. E. with the two conditions as presented.

### 9.4. Resolution 2024-21 250 Industrial Blvd. CUP Amendment— Hannah Ryback, WSB

- The Applicant has requested to expand the footprint of the outdoor storage area by removing the existing berm.
- The area of the removed berm would be graveled, and a new 8-foot screening fence would be constructed on the eastern property line.
- The Planning Commission voted unanimously to recommend approval of the requested conditional use permit amendment, subject to the following conditions.
  - Existing trees shall be shown on the "Certificate of Survey & Topographic Survey" for location reference.
  - The Applicant shall obtain any necessary permits.
  - One additional tree shall be planted within the landscaped area at the front of the property.
  - Site alterations shall adhere to the plans submitted with this application.
  - Vehicles exceeding 3/4 ton capacity shall be parked within the screened outdoor storage area. No more than ten vehicles exceeding %-ton capacity associated with the primary use

- of the property shall be permitted to park on the property unless parked within an enclosed building
- The CUP shall be subject to annual review. A change in ownership, operations, or operator shall cause the permit to be reviewed by the City to determine whether an application for an amendment or similar consideration is necessary.

CH/BA Motion to approve Resolution 2024-21; Approving an Amendment to a Conditional Use Permit for the Expansion of the Outdoor Storage Area and the Storage of Vehicles Exceeding ¾ Ton Capacity at 250 Industrial Blvd with the presented eight conditions. Motion passed 5-0.

- 9.5. Resolution 2024-22 Comp Plan Amendment: Rezoning Outlot A— Hannah Ryback, WSB
  - Reguiding 92 acres of low-density residential land to medium-density residential.
  - Reguiding four parcels (710 Faxon Rd., 28 Industrial Blvd. & 31 Industrial Blvd. from Commercial to Mixed Use Commercial/Industrial.
  - The Planning Commission voted unanimously to recommend approval of the requested Comprehensive Plan Amendment, subject to the following conditions.
    - The Comprehensive Plan Amendment must have final approval by the Metropolitan Council.

CH/BA Motion to adopt Resolution 2024-22, Approving the Comprehensive Plan Amendment Related to Changes to the Future Land Use Map. Motion passed 5-0.

- 9.6. Resolution 2024-23 and Ordinance 373; B-1 to P-1 Rezonings— Hannah Ryback, WSB
  - Rezoning all B-1 Business Industrial parces to I-1 Light Industrial
    - The app of the properties within the B-1 Zoning District is proposed to be changed to I-1, as the B-1 District no longer exists.
  - Rezoning of PIDs 586520890, 580760120, and 586530440 from R-1 Low-Density Single-Family Residential to P-1 Parks/Open Space.
    - These properties are publicly owned by the City of NYA and the Minnesota DNR.
  - The Planning Commission voted unanimously to recommend approval of the requested rezonings.

CH/CS Motion to approve Resolution 2024-23 Approving a Request Rezoning to Subject Parcels. Motion passed 5-0.

CH/MM Motion to approve Ordinance 373 Amending Chapter 1225.02 of the Norwood Young America City Code. Motion passed 5-0.

- 9.7. Norwood Baseball—Improvements at NYA Sports Complex Zellmann Field Karen Hallquist, CED Director
  - The Norwood Baseball team plans to replace the NYA Sports Complex Zellmann Field scoreboard.
    - The existing scoreboard is 30+ years old, and due to its age, replacement parts are not available.
    - The cost of the new scoreboard is approximately \$60,000, which includes installation.
  - The baseball team will replace the canvas batter's eye screen with a steel trellis that will support climbing ivy plants.
    - The Delano Ball Club will provide clippings of their ivy for 60 starter plants for the climbing ivy.
  - The baseball team intends to plant approximately a dozen evergreen trees along the outfield fence.
  - The baseball team will add a new menu board and an over-the-counter sign as a second means of acknowledgment for the new scoreboard sponsors.
  - The 2025 City Capital Improvement Project Fund has \$75,000 dedicated to sandblasting and repainting the light poles around Zellmann Field.

CH/BA Motion to recommend approval of the 2024 projects as presented by the Norwood Baseball team. Motion passed 4-0.

- 9.8. 2024 First Quarter Report—Mitchell Thiesfeld, City Clerk-Treasurer/Finance Director
  - The General Fund expenses are right where they should be after the first quarter.
  - Both enterprise funds, Water & Sewer, are above-expected expenditures.
    - This is due to debt service payments that have been made.
    - If the debt service payments aren't included, they are aligned with where they should be

CS.MM Motion to accept the 1st quarter financial overview for 2024. Motion passed 5-0.

- 9.9. Transient Merchant Application The Squeaky Cow, Inc. Mitchell Thiesfeld, Clerk/Finance Director
  - The food truck serves hamburgers, cheese curds, & other deep-fried foods.

MM/CH Motion to approve the Transient Merchant Application from Craig Pexa, doing business as The Squeaky Cow, Inc., and not to exceed 120 consecutive days at any one location as listed in Chapter 3, Section 310 of the City Code. Motion passed 5-0.

- 9.10. Lifeguard Appointments for 2024 Mitchell Thiesfeld, Clerk/Finance Director
  - Fifteen total lifeguards for 2024.
  - Ten are returning lifeguards, and five are new.
  - Four lifeguards already have their WSI certification, and a few more plan on getting certified.

MM/CS Motion to approve hiring the listed Lifeguards for the 2024 Season at the West Carver Community Pool, contingent on completing the required certifications. Motion passed 5-0.



**SUBJECT PROPERTY:** 108 Hilltop Cir.

**ZONING:** The property is zoned R-2 Medium Density Single Family Residential

**LAND USE**: The Future Land Use Map within the 2040 Comprehensive Plan guides this property for Low Density Residential use.

### **OVERVIEW OF THE REQUEST**

Property owner, Dan Stender, has requested a variance to allow placement of a shed within a drainage and utility easement, and with a reduced side yard setback at the subject property. There is a ditch running along the northwest property line, which results in a 25 foot drainage and utility easement along that property line. This is a larger than typical easement; the standard rear lot line easement is 10 feet.

The proposed shed is  $12 \times 24$ , totaling 288 square feet. The Applicant intends to place the shed on skids. This would make it possible to move the shed, should the easement ever need to be accessed.




Image 1: Plat - black outline indicates property lines, yellow lines indicate easements

Variances have been requested to allow the shed to be placed partially within the drainage and utility easement, and for the shed to be placed two feet from the side property line.

A variance of three feet from the required five-foot side yard setback has been requested.

### 1220.02 Permitted Yard Encroachments

A. No encroachment shall be permitted in existing or required drainage and utility easements.

A variance has been requested to allow the shed to encroach on the drainage and utility easement.

#### **ENGINEERING CONSIDERATIONS**

The City Engineer has reviewed the request and offers the following comments:

I have no comments or concerns with this as long as the shed is not constructed on any type of permanent foundation and with the condition that it is the property owner's responsibility to move the shed if needed to facilitate an allowable public improvement within the easement.

### **VARIANCE REVIEW**

The City Council may grant variances from the literal provisions of this Ordinance where their strict enforcement would cause practical difficulties because of circumstances unique to the individual property under consideration, and to grant such variances only when it is demonstrated that such actions will be in harmony with the general purpose and intent of this Ordinance, and consistent with the comprehensive plan.

### Criteria for Approval of Variances

The Planning Commission is required to examine the request under a series of general standards as set forth under Section 1210.04 Variance, Subd. 1:

- A. Practical Difficulties. Practical difficulties as used in connection with the granting of a variance means that:
  - 1. The property owner proposes to use the property in a reasonable manner not permitted by the zoning ordinance.

The Applicant's request to place a shed, on skids, within the easement is reasonable. If the easement needs to be accessed, the shed can be moved. **Criterion met.** 

2. The plight of the landowner is due to circumstances unique to the property not created by the landowner.

The 25-foot rear yard easement is not typical. The presence of the easement limits the area where a shed can be placed in the rear yard. **Criterion met.** 

3. The variance, if granted, will not alter the essential character of the locality.

The requested variances will have no impact on the character of the area. The property owner next door has provided support for the shed being placed closer to the side property line than the Ordinance allows. **Criterion met.** 

B. Economic Considerations. Economic considerations alone shall not constitute a practical difficulty.

The proposed variances to allow the property owner to place the shed in the desired location are not financially motivated. **Criterion met.** 

C. The variance is in harmony with the purpose and intent of the Ordinance.

The shed being placed on skids within the easement is not in conflict with the Ordinance. The shed can be moved if easement access is needed. The intent of the side yard setback requirement is to ensure adequate separation between buildings and neighboring property. The neighboring property owner supports the reduced side yard setback. **Criterion met.** 

D. The variance is consistent with the comprehensive plan.

The variance will not alter the Low Density Residential use of the property. Criterion met.

#### RECOMMENDED ACTION

At their May 7, 2024 regular meeting, the Planning Commission voted unanimously to **recommend approval** of the requested variances, subject to the following conditions:

- 1. A building permit application shall be submitted and approved prior to construction of the shed.
- 2. The shed may not be constructed on any type of permanent foundation.
- 3. It is the property owner's responsibility to move the shed if needed to facilitate an allowable public improvement within the easement.

#### **MOTION LANGUAGE**

WHEREAS, the City Council can approve a variance if it finds that the standards for granting a variance as described in Chapter 12, Section 1210.04 of the Norwood Young America City Code have been met.

BE IT RESOLVED, that the City Council of Norwood Young America, Carver County, Minnesota approves the Applicant's requests for variances to allow a shed to be placed within an easement and with a reduced setback from the side property line.

The requested variance is consistent with all of the standards for granting a variance as described in Chapter 12, Section 1210.04. More specifically, the City Council finds that the requested variance is justified for the following reasons:

1. The proposed placement of the shed is reasonable.

- 2. The placement of the shed will not negatively affect the ditch and will not interfere with the purpose of the easement.
- 3. The variances will not alter the essential character of the locality.
- 4. The variances are in harmony with the purpose and intent of the Ordinance.
- 5. The variances are consistent with the Comprehensive Plan.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Applicant must meet the following conditions for variance approval:

- 1. A building permit application shall be submitted and approved prior to construction of the shed.




