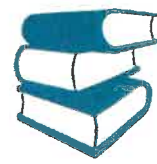

Illegal Garbage Dumping

It has come to the City's attention that there has been an abundance of improper garbage disposal within our city dumpsters and at the compost site. While we appreciate your efforts to keep our city clean, adhering to proper waste disposal protocols is essential.

We want to remind everyone that dumping garbage, TVs, appliances, mattresses, or anything else in city dumpsters is strictly prohibited. Violators will be subject to ticketing and fines by Law Enforcement. This measure is in place to maintain the cleanliness and functionality of our waste management systems.

Furthermore, recent incidents of dumping at the Compost site have been reported. This behavior poses environmental hazards and disrupts the efficiency of our composting operations. In response, we have installed surveillance cameras to monitor these areas. Any violators caught on camera will face ticketing and fines by Law Enforcement.

Continued disregard for these regulations may lead to the permanent closure of the Compost site. We urge all residents to dispose of their waste responsibly and utilize designated facilities for proper disposal. Our City-wide clean-up will be held on April 27 from 8 AM to 10 AM. Thank you for your cooperation in keeping our city clean and environmentally sustainable.

Clean It Up & Clean It Out

Spring is now upon us and as the weather gets nicer, it is the perfect opportunity to take note of your properties and clean up any blight or possible code violations. We invite you to take part in our annual **NYA Spring Clean Up Day on April 27th from 8:00am – 10:00am** and help keep our city beautiful!

Some of the most common code violations include:

- 1. Yard Maintenance**—Maintenance of yards and right-of-way abutting property including sidewalks are the responsibility of the property owner. The right-of-way must be free of obstructions caused by trees, vegetation, or other objects. Sidewalks should be free of any potential trip hazards and repaired if necessary.
- 2. Inoperative or Junk Vehicle**—Inoperative and/or Junk Vehicles are not permitted. A vehicle is considered inoperable if a current vehicle tag is displayed and/or it is not fully equipped to operate on public streets legally and safely. These must be stored in a garage and out of the public view.
- 3. Junk, Trash and Debris**—Junk, auto parts, furniture, trash, tires, building materials, tree trimmings, and any other debris cannot be left in the yard and must be properly disposed of.
- 4. Parking**—Parking is permitted for passenger cars and motorcycles in residential properties only on a legal driveway or in a garage. Over-sized vehicles such as campers, large trucks or trailers should not be parked on public streets for any extended periods of time.
- 5. Outdoor Storage**—You may not keep indoor furniture, household appliances, auto parts, building materials, or any other similar items outside in public view.

NYA Spring Clean Up Day

FREE event is for NYA CITY RESIDENTS who reside within the city limits ONLY — businesses are not included. This drop-off event is for non-hazardous household waste/junk. Participants will be asked to show proof of residency such as a driver's license and/or water bill. This drop-off event is for all residential dwellings including apartments and manufactured homes. FYI—ID's will be checked.

ACCEPTABLE HOUSEHOLD WASTE/JUNK—ITEMS FOR DROP-OFF

- ◆ Furniture items (couches, chairs, tables, lamps, mattresses, box springs, etc.)
- ◆ Small amounts of remodeling materials (carpet, siding, drywall, concrete blocks, bricks, etc.)
- ◆ Miscellaneous items such as kids toys, playground sets, doors, windows, toilets, etc.
- ◆ Participants are asked to bag and box the loose materials as much as possible

UNACCEPTABLE ITEMS

- ◆ Regular household weekly garbage or recyclable items
- ◆ Vehicle tires, appliances, any electronics, batteries, fire extinguishers, propane tanks, prescription drugs
- ◆ No hazardous waste such as paints, liquids, chemicals, asbestos materials, herbicides, pesticides, household cleaning products, lawn chemicals, lighter fluid, mothballs, lye, pool chemicals, nail polish remover, solvents, spot removers, stains and finishers, etc.
- ◆ No motor oil/filters, oil rags, petroleum products/containers, anti-freeze, brake fluid
- ◆ Fluorescent tubes/lights, incandescent light bulbs
- ◆ Cement, asphalt, large quantities of demo material
- ◆ No yard waste (grass clippings, shrubs, plants, tree limbs, leaves, garden waste)

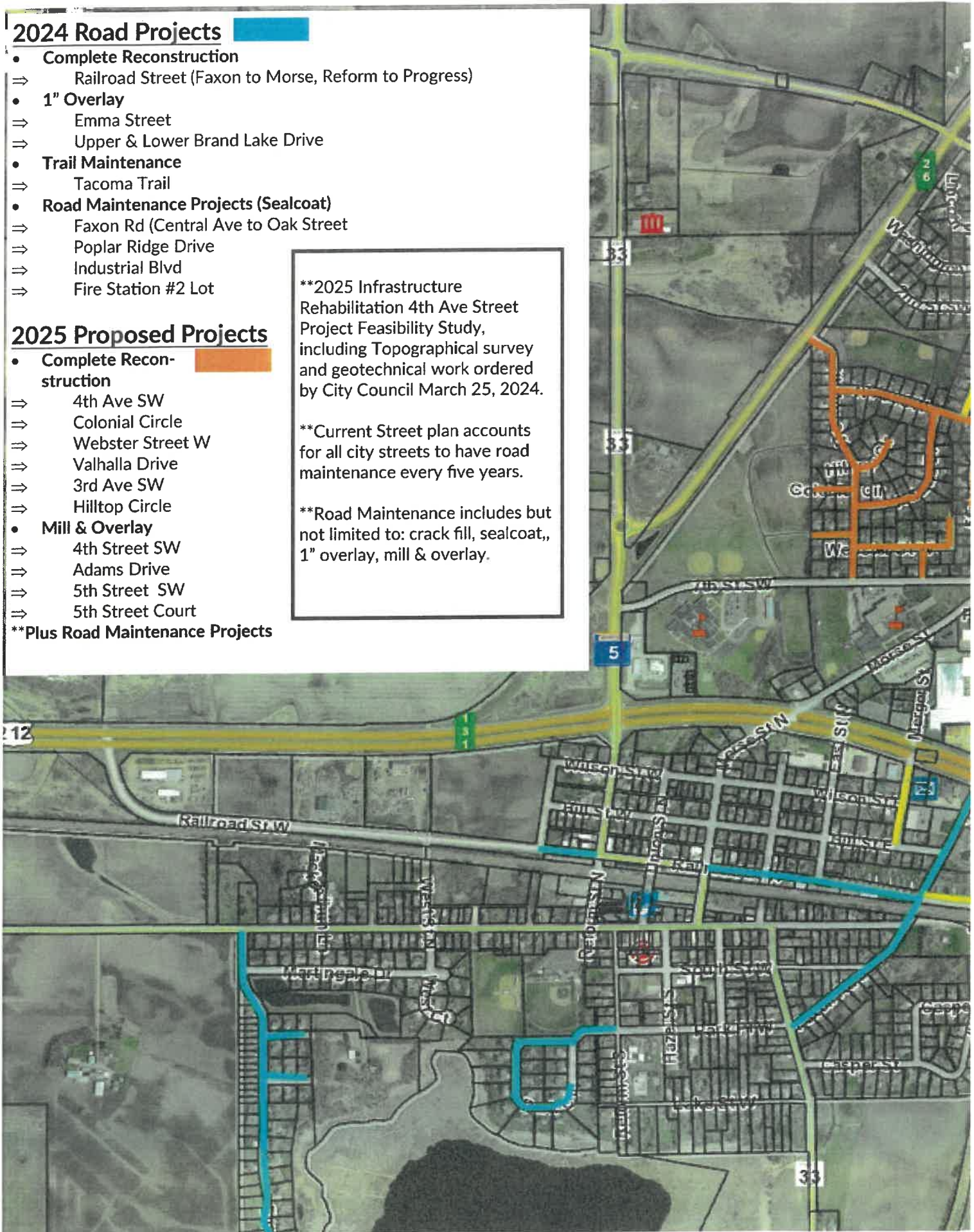

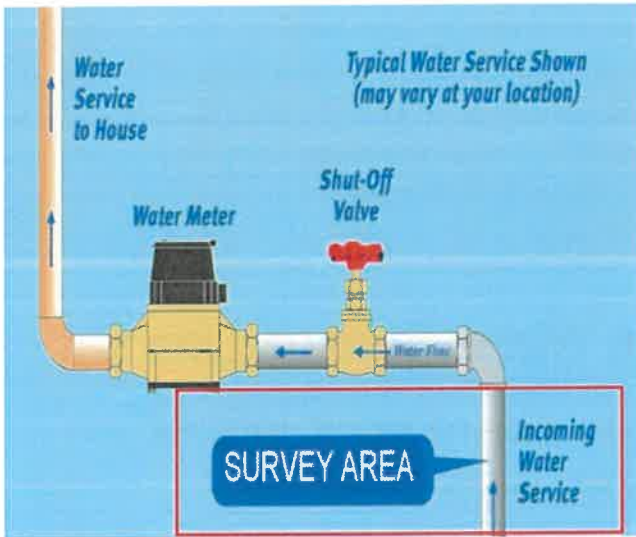

Lead-Safe Community Water Service Line Material Survey

URGENT REQUEST FOR INFORMATION NEEDED FROM EVERY BUILDING THAT RECEIVES NORWOOD YOUNG AMERICA WATER SERVICE



The Environmental Protection Agency's Lead and Copper Rule Revisions (LCRR) require all buildings within city limits that receive water service to undergo an examination of its water service line to identify the presence of lead pipes. The US Environmental Protection Agency mandated the removal of 100% of lead service lines and collecting this data is part of this requirement. Water Departments must complete an inventory of the service lines in their system and report the information to the EPA.

To be successful, the City of NYA needs your help by completing the **Water Service Line Material Survey** to identify the type and size of your service line. **Please use the following guidelines as a reference to satisfy the minimum requirements required of the LCRR lead service line inventory.**






1. **Locate your water meter** (usually in the basement) and look for the pipe entering the house from outside that connects to the water meter.
2. **Take a picture of the Water Service Line.** If this has paint or corrosion, scrape or remove such coverings for a clear identification of the service line material prior to the picture. If the material of the service water line looks gray, use a magnet on the clean surface. If the magnet sticks, please show in picture. (Note: Lead pipes are non-magnetic and easily scratched with a coin).
3. **Choose (1) one of these ways to share your Water Service Line information:**
 - a. Access the Water Service Line Material Survey by visiting <https://arcg.is/1nqf5v> or snap a photo of the QR code and fill out the requested information:
 - b. If you cannot access the survey, please submit pictures to: ReportMyInfoNYA@gmail.com. When submitting pictures, include your physical address in the Subject Line. (i.e. Water Service Pics, 123 Main Street).
 - c. If you are unable to take a picture of your water service and meter, please call NYA City Hall at 952-467-1800 to make an appointment for a City Public Works Employee to enter your home to assist you. The appointment will take less than 10 minutes.



Safe drinking water is our top priority. The City of Norwood Young America Lead-Safe Community website provides you access to the Water Service Line Inventory results, additional guidance on how to determine if you have a lead service line, and any action the City of NYA needs to take. 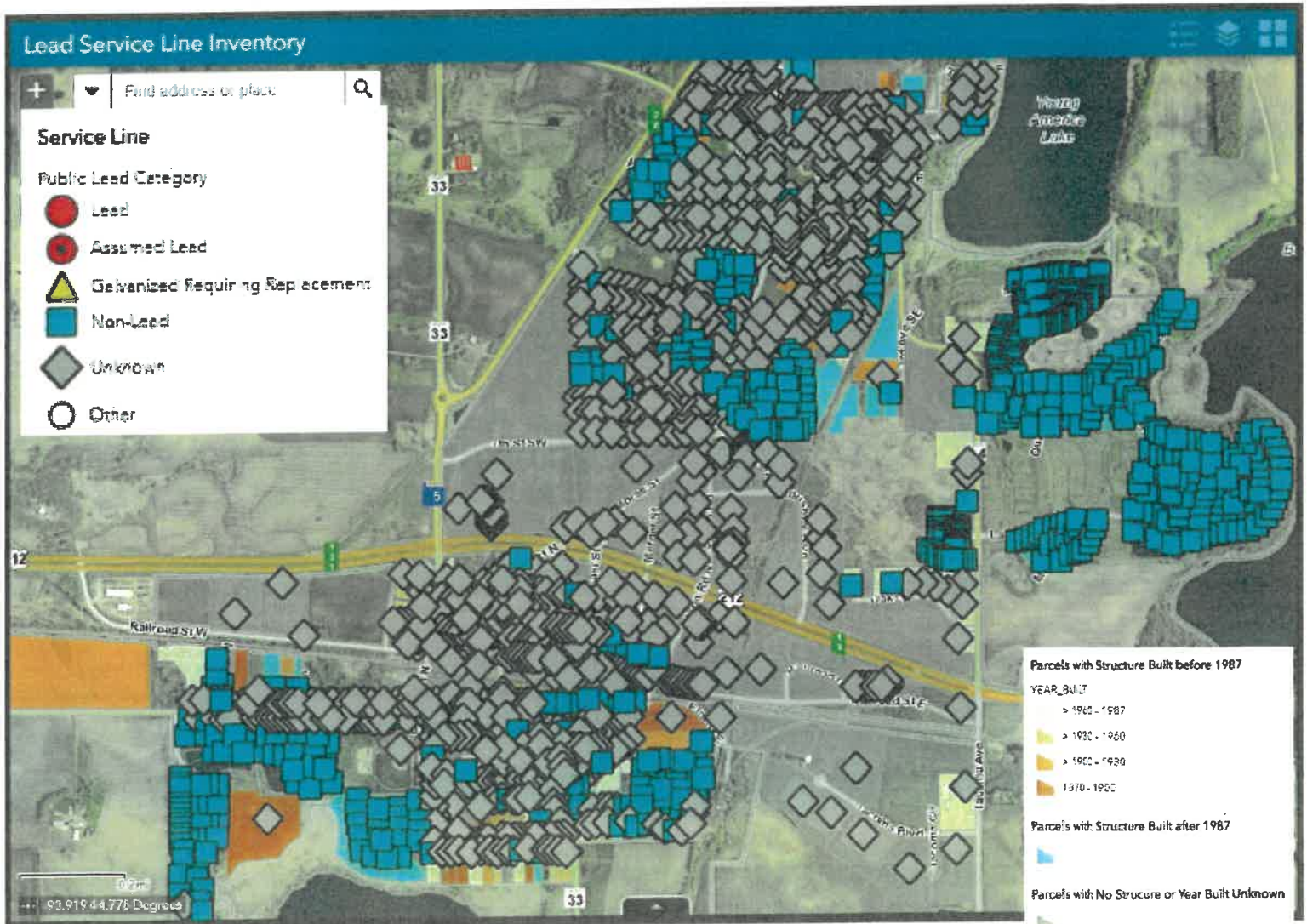
All Water Service Line buildings must be reported to the EPA by October 2024. Homeowners with any questions can call NYA City Hall at 952-467-1800.

<p>Galvanized </p> <p>A dull, silver-gray color. Use a magnet - strong magnets will typically cling to galvanized pipes.</p>	
<p>Copper </p> <p>The color of a copper penny.</p>	
<p>Plastic </p> <p>White, rigid pipe that is joined to water supply piping with a clamp.</p>

Mosquito Control Activity Has Begun in Your Community

Metropolitan Mosquito Control District trucks, helicopters, and staff will be out in neighborhoods and parks this spring and summer working to reduce mosquito-borne disease and annoyance.

April 12, 2024, SAINT PAUL – There was nothing normal about the winter of 2023-24. Unseasonably warm temperatures and a lack of snowfall for much of December through February gave way to relatively cool temperatures and moderate precipitation in late March and early April. In early spring, mosquitoes tend to stay in the water as larvae for longer, but as air temperatures rise, they begin to emerge as adult mosquitoes. The warming expected in the coming weeks, means adult mosquito activity will increase in late April and May.

The Metropolitan Mosquito Control District (MMCD) will be conducting surveillance and treatment activities in your community to reduce the risk of disease and annoyance in an environmentally-sensitive manner. Each year field staff at MMCD monitors and treats wetlands that breed mosquitoes with a fleet of trucks and helicopters. Many of our seasonal staff begin working in April and residents of the seven county metro area may notice the green or white trucks with the MMCD logo or staff on bikes or on foot wearing brightly colored "Mosquito Control" shirts.

At times MMCD employees may need to cross private property for access to check and treat areas for mosquito larvae. If you have questions about mosquito control activities or concerns about an employee, please call the MMCD front desk at (651) 645-9149 or visit MMCD.org.

Some of the activities that MMCD may be doing in your community include:

- Wetland surveillance - determining if ponds or swamps have mosquito larvae present.
- Catch basin surveillance - pulling off grates and inspecting neighborhood catch basins to determine if mosquito larvae are present.
- Ground larval treatments - applying control materials to a wetland with a hand spreader or backpack.
- Helicopter larval treatments - applying control materials to a wetland via helicopter.
- UAS/drone larval treatments – applying control materials via drone.
- Catch basin treatments - applying control materials to neighborhood catch basins.
- Setting or collecting traps - surveillance helps MMCD determine where and what types of mosquitoes are active.

The control materials and methods used by MMCD are regularly tested for safety and only applied when surveillance indicates they would be effective. The active ingredients are specifically designed to target mosquito larvae or adults with minimal impacts on non-target insects. The control materials are not harmful to people, pets, or wildlife. Sump Pump Regulations

All sump pumps must be day-lighted into your yard or into the storm sewer—not into your neighbors yard or a public sidewalk. Sump pumps should also not be connected into a sanitary sewer drain! Doing so results in the treatment of unnecessary amounts of water, putting additional strain on the treatment system and raising prices for everyone.

Golf Cart/ATV Permit

Chapter 7 of the NYA City Code allows for a person to drive a Golf Cart (from April 1st to November 1st only) or Class 2 ATV on City streets as long as a permit is obtained and the operator has a valid driver's license. There is an annual permit fee of \$10.00 for these recreational vehicles. Applications can be filled out right at City Hall or found on the City website at www.cityofnyna.com.
