The City will reconstruct Railroad Street from Faxon Road to Franklin Street and Reform Street to Progress Street. Carver County will focus on the Highway 212 four-lane expansion project from Cologne to Norwood Young America, including the overpass at the Bongards intersection. Both projects have been eagerly anticipated and will be magnificent additions to our community.

Wilson Street/Merger Street Changes

Please remember that Wilson Street ends at Merger Street. There is no direct access to Merger Street from Faxon Road through the privately-owned parking lot of Citizens State Bank, Lazy Loon Lanes, USPS, and Carquest. Please use Hill Street as the appropriate access point between Merger Street and Faxon Road.

You may have noticed the significant gym addition on the north side of the Central Schools building (7th Street SW). This will be the home of the new indoor Walking Track! This project is a joint venture between the Central Public Schools and the City of NYA. Look for more information on this fabulous addition to our community in the months ahead.

2024 Election Cycle

March 5th: Presidential Nomination Primary

August 13th: State Primary November 5th: General Election

March 5, 2024. Will all parties participate in the presidential primary?

No, only major parties will participate.

When will the next presidential primary take place?

Will all parties be on the same ballot?

No, each participating major party will have a separate ballot.

Common Questions About the Presidential Primary

Who decides which candidates will appear on a party's ballot?

The chair of each party will submit a list of candidates for the party's ballot no later than 63 days before the date of the presidential primary (January 2, 2024).

What if a candidate drops out before the primary?

Once a party's list is submitted, changes will not be made to candidates that will appear on the ballot.

Will there be a place to write in a choice or vote for "uncommitted"?

Only if it is requested by the party chair. Party chairs will need to submit names of write-in candidates to be counted seven days before the primary.

Will any other offices be on the ballot?

No, only presidential candidates from a major party will appear on the presidential primary ballot. Other offices with a primary will be on the primary ballot in August.

Who can vote in the presidential primary?

Any voter registered in Minnesota. Voters can pre-register through February 13 (at Carver County Government Center), or register at the polling place when they vote. Note that voters must turn 18 years old by March 5 to vote in the presidential primary.

How will I be able to vote in the presidential primary?

Registered voters will be able to vote at their polling place on presidential primary day (NYA City Hall) or by absentee ballot in the 46 days before presidential primary day (starting January 19, 2024 and only at Carver County). A voter must request the ballot of the party of their choice. If a voter refuses to select a party, they will not be able to vote in the presidential primary.

Will other people know which party's ballot I request?

A voter's choice of party ballot will be recorded and is private data. However, a list will be provided to the chair of each major political party of voters who selected that party. How a voter voted on the ballot will be secret.

Will parties have to abide by the primary results?

The presidential primary results must bind the election of delegates in each party.

Who will pay for the presidential nomination primary?

County and municipalities will be reimbursed by the state for the primary costs.

How much will the primary cost?

In 2020, the cost to administer the presidential primary was \$9.6 million. Counties and municipalities will be reimbursed for their costs of administering the Presidential Nomination Primary following the election.

Is the presidential nomination primary the same as the presidential primary?

Yes, the official name of this election is "presidential nomination primary" but it is most commonly known simply as the presidential -Information provided by The Office of the Minnesota Secretary of State primary.



Just a few reminders...

Hockey & Skating Rink

The hockey and free-skate rinks are open now at South Park. The warming house is also open! Please be respectful of this community space—clean up all garbage and absolutely no smoking! If you see someone being destructive at the warming house, please report to the Carver County non-emergency line at 952-361-1231.

Pet Reminders

You must have your pet licensed annually with the City—\$5/year per pet. Stop at City Hall with up-to-date vaccine papers. Always have your pet on a leash or restraint when walking around town. Please be a responsible dog owner and clean up after them!

ATV/Golf Cart Licenses for 2023

The 2024 licenses for ATV and golf carts are now available for \$10. This is an annual fee for those residents using ATVs or golf carts on city streets. Stop at City Hall with a current drivers license and insurance card for the vehicle.

Snow reminders

- **No parking of cars, trailers, or garbage cans on streets during a snow event (of 2" or more) until the road is plowed curb-to-curb.
- **Priority of plowing is emergency routes, business districts, residential streets, alleys, and trails.
- **The City will once again be enforcing its ticketing and towing of vehicles that violate parking on city streets during a snow event. Per City Code Chapter 7: Traffic and Vehicles, violators failing to follow City Code will be ticketed and towed at the owner's expense. All ticket fines must be paid with the Carver County Court Administrator's Office. Vehicles that are towed will be taken to Smith Oil and Food Mart in Norwood Young America. Before getting their vehicle back, the vehicle owner will be required to pay all towing fees and show proof of vehicle ownership, proof of vehicle insurance, and a valid driver's license. The vehicle will also need to an have up-to-date license and registration.
- **There are designated parking areas for residents who do not have off-street parking available during snow emergencies. Parking in designated areas will be enforced from 2am-6am. The two designated parking areas within city limits are the north side of the Elm Street Municipal Parking Lot and the north side of the Old City Hall/Food Shelf building. Watch for signs.
