In addition, our Senior Advisory Commission plans periodic Lunch and Learns on topics important to our Senior population. Make sure to watch for information on the upcoming “Senior” Prom that is a multi-generational event to encourage senior citizens and youth to enjoy time together. 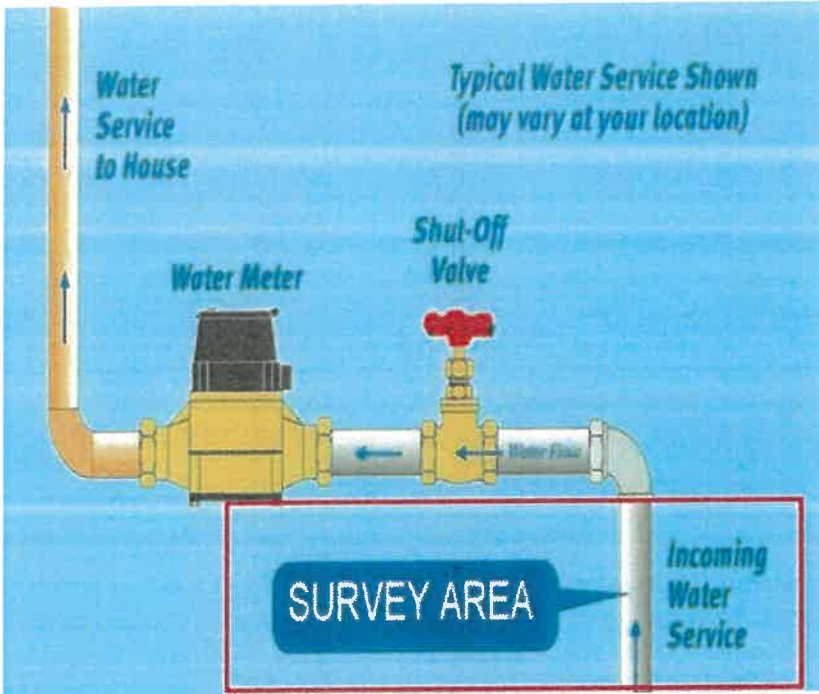

## City of Norwood Young America Lead-Safe Community Water Service Line Material Survey

**URGENT REQUEST FOR INFORMATION  
NEEDED FROM EVERY BUILDING THAT  
RECEIVES NORWOOD YOUNG AMERICA  
WATER SERVICE**

The Environmental Protection Agency's Lead and Copper Rule Revisions (LCRR) require all buildings within city limits that receive water service to undergo an examination of its water service line to identify the presence of lead pipes. The US Environmental Protection Agency mandated the removal of 100% of lead service lines and collecting this data is part of this requirement. Water Departments must complete an inventory of the service lines in their system and report the information to the EPA.

To be successful, the City of NYA needs your help by completing the **Water Service Line Material Survey** to identify the type and size of your service line. **Please use the following guidelines as a reference to satisfy the minimum requirements required of the LCRR lead service line inventory.**


1. **Locate your water meter** (usually in the basement) and look for the pipe entering the house from outside that connects to the water meter.
2. **Take a picture of the Water Service Line.** If this has paint or corrosion, scrape or remove such coverings for a clear identification of the service line material prior to the picture. If the material of the service water line looks gray, use a magnet on the clean surface. If the magnet sticks, please show in picture. (Note: Lead pipes are non-magnetic and easily scratched with a coin).
3. **Choose (1) one of these ways to share your Water Service Line information:**
  - a. Access the Water Service Line Material Survey by visiting <https://arcg.is/1nqf5v> or snap a photo of the QR code and fill out the requested information:
  - b. If you cannot access the survey, please submit pictures to: [ReportMyInfoNYA@gmail.com](mailto:ReportMyInfoNYA@gmail.com). When submitting pictures, include your physical address in the Subject Line. (i.e. Water Service Pics, 123 Main Street).
  - c. If you are unable to take a picture of your water service and meter, please call NYA City Hall at 952-467-1800 to make an appointment for a City Public Works Employee to enter your home to assist you. The appointment will take no longer than 10 minutes.





Safe drinking water is our top priority. The City of Norwood Young America Lead-Safe Community website provides you access to the Water Service Line Inventory results, additional guidance on how to determine if you have a lead service line, and any action the City of NYA needs to take. All Water Service Line buildings must be reported to the EPA by October 2024. Homeowners with any questions can call NYA City Hall at 952-467-1800.



**Lead**   
 A dull, silver-gray color that is easily scratched with a coin.  
 Use a magnet - strong magnets will not cling to lead pipes.

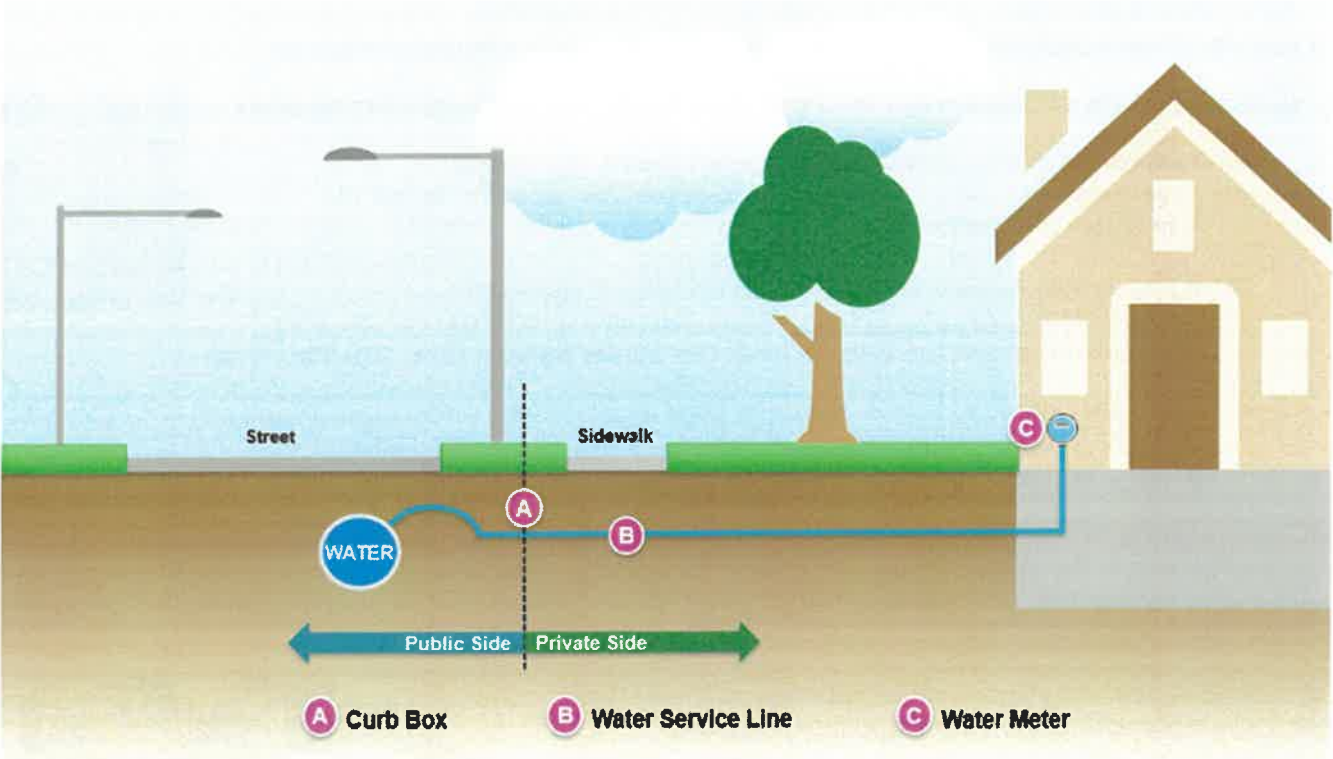
**Galvanized**   
 A dull, silver-gray color. Use a magnet - strong magnets will typically cling to galvanized pipes.

**Copper**   
 The color of a copper penny.

**Plastic**   
 White, rigid pipe that is joined to water supply piping with a clamp.

## What is a service line?

The service line connects the water main to the property. The water utility owns the utility-owned portion of the service line, and the customer owns the customer-owned portion of the service line.

The NYA Spring Clean Up Day is a FREE event is for **NYA CITY RESIDENTS** who reside within the city limits ONLY – businesses are not included. This drop-off event is for non-hazardous household waste/junk. Participants will be asked to show proof of residency such as a driver's license and/or water bill. This drop-off event is for all residential dwellings including apartments and manufactured homes. FYI–ID's will be checked.

## ACCEPTABLE HOUSEHOLD WASTE/JUNK–ITEMS FOR DROP-OFF

- ◆ Furniture items (couches, chairs, tables, lamps, mattresses, box springs, etc.)
- ◆ Small amounts of remodeling materials (carpet, siding, drywall, concrete blocks, bricks, etc.)
- ◆ Miscellaneous items such as kids toys, playground sets, doors, windows, toilets, etc.
- ◆ Participants are asked to bag and box the loose materials as much as possible

## UNACCEPTABLE ITEMS

- ◆ Regular household weekly garbage or recyclable items
- ◆ Vehicle tires, appliances, any electronics, batteries, fire extinguishers, propane tanks, prescription drugs
- ◆ No hazardous waste such as paints, liquids, chemicals, asbestos materials, herbicides, pesticides, household cleaning products, lawn chemicals, lighter fluid, mothballs, lye, pool chemicals, nail polish remover, solvents, spot removers, stains and finishers, etc.
- ◆ No motor oil/filters, oil rags, petroleum products/containers, anti-freeze, brake fluid
- ◆ Fluorescent tubes/lights, incandescent light bulbs
- ◆ Cement, asphalt, large quantities of demo material

If you see a non-resident or business utilizing this site, please call the Carver County non-emergency line at 952-361-1231 and report the illegal dumping, a license number and description of the vehicle. **Location:** 640 Tacoma Blvd (located within the Tacoma West Industrial Park) **Hours:** Dawn to Dusk.

## Sump Pump Regulations

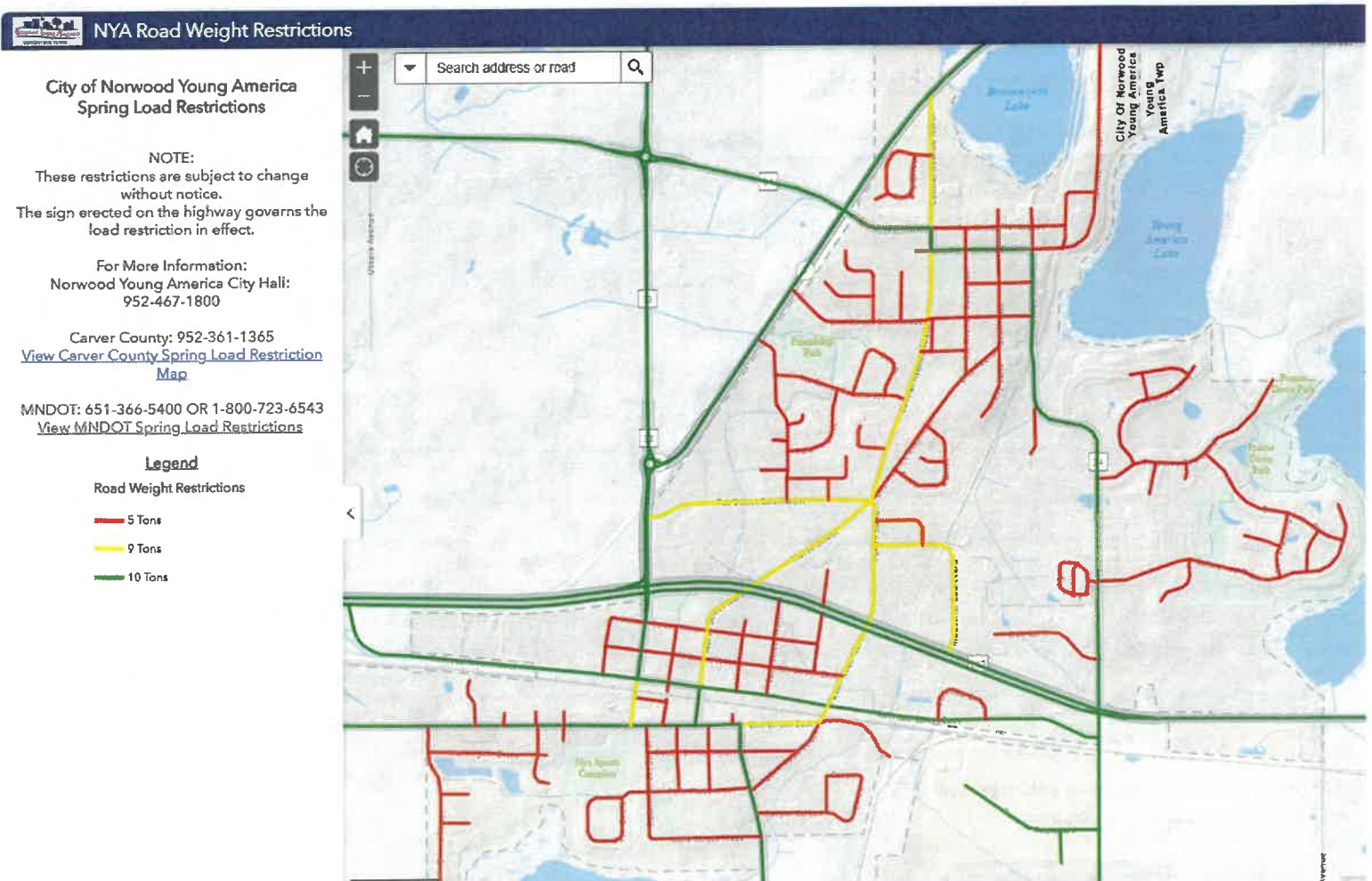
All sump pumps must be day-lighted into your yard or into the storm sewer—NOT into your neighbor's yard or a public sidewalk. Sump pumps should also not be connected into the sanitary sewer. Doing so results in the treatment of unnecessary amounts of water, putting additional strain on the treatment system and raising prices for everyone.

## Traffic Concerns

The City of NYA contracts with the Carver County Sheriff's Office for all emergency and non-emergency services. If you have a traffic complaint, please call the Carver County non-emergency line at 952-361-1231. If you are witness to a traffic accident or if someone is in danger, please call 911.

## NYA Road Weight Restrictions

In order to protect and prolong the service life of the roadways, road weight restrictions are imposed during the spring thaw every year, when the roadbeds are most susceptible to damage (due to the weakened subgrade).





# Welcome to NYA, 212 Tobacco!

The NYA Area Chamber of Commerce, City Council, and NYA Economic Development Commission welcomed owner Syed Mahmood and 212 Tobacco with a ribbon cutting on Wednesday, March 13th. ## What is Impervious Surface Coverage?

The favorable weather has started to spur many home improvement projects including sheds, patios, decks, garage pads, etc. An important part of the permitting process is checking the impervious surface coverage of the property to confirm that there is enough remaining greenspace for the project. So, what is "impervious surface coverage?" It is any type of human-made surface that does not absorb rainfall. It is a constructed hard surface that either prevents or slows down the entry of water into the soil and causes water to run off the surface in greater quantities and at an increased rate of flow than prior to development. Examples include (but not limited to) decks, rooftops, sidewalks, patios, permeable pavers, storage areas/sheds, and concrete, asphalt or gravel driveways. MN Statute (462.357 Official Controls: Zoning Ordinance) and MN DNR guides Shoreland Overlay Districts and impervious surface coverage regulations. These regulations are in place to protect MN waters.

What does that mean for Norwood Young America residents? NYA is surrounded by five bodies of water. According to MN Statute, Shoreland Overlay Districts restrict lot coverages within 1,000 feet of a body of water to 25% impervious surface coverage (properties within the orange areas below). Why? Too much impervious coverage leads to unnecessary erosion, drainage concerns, and potential flooding. Residents who do NOT live within the Shoreland Overlay Districts are allowed a 35% impervious surface coverage. Downtown Districts are exempt from the Shoreland Overlay Districts as they can have up to 100% lot coverage due to the nature of the use of the property/location.

If you are preparing for a house project, you can measure your lot coverage and impervious surface coverage by going to the Carver County Property GIS map and using their online measuring tools. You can also call City Hall at 952-467-1800 or email office@cityofnya.com for help.

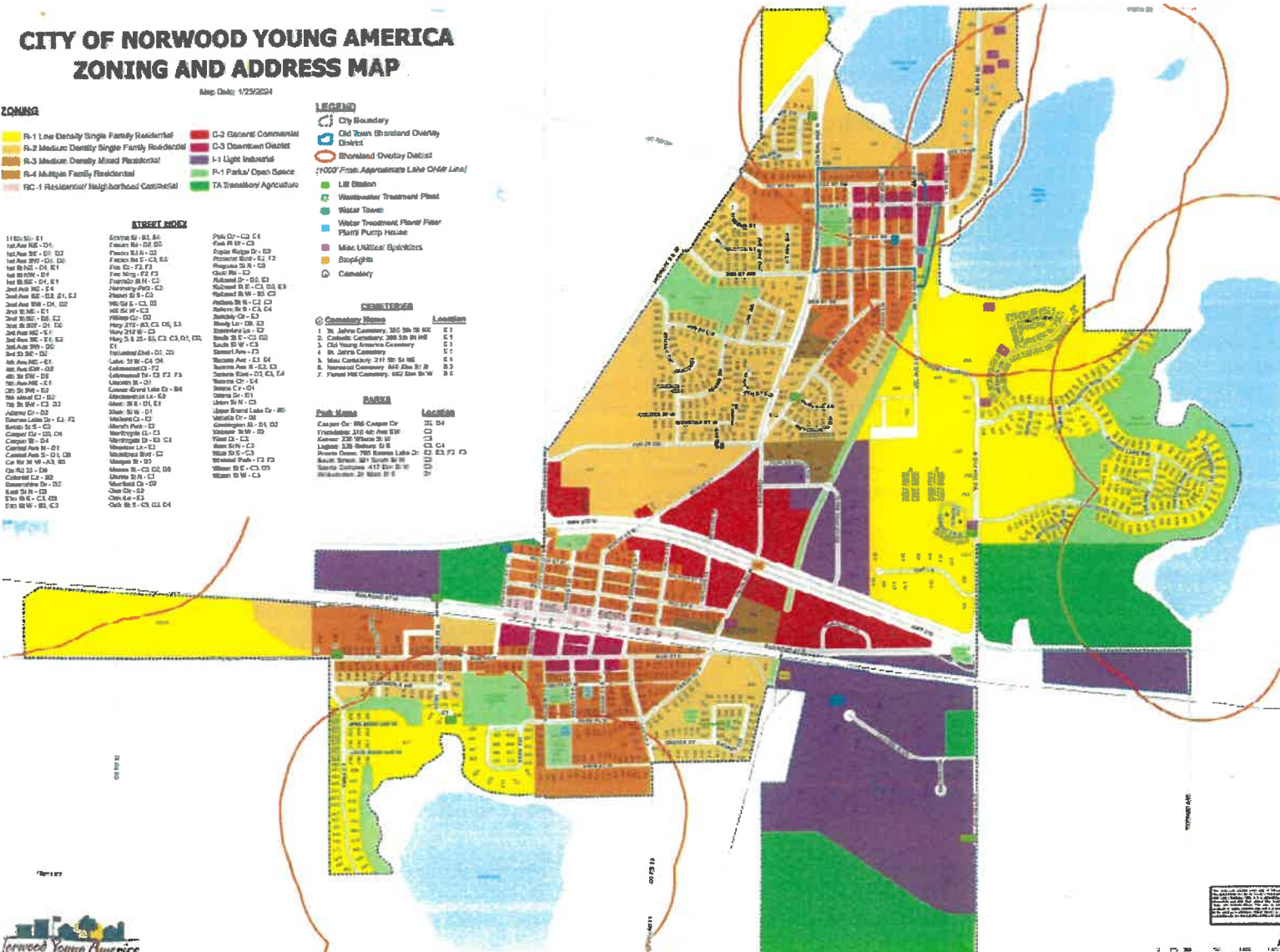

## Home Improvements Projects

As you are preparing for spring improvements to your properties, make sure to check with the City at 952-467-1800 for any Permitting, zoning requirements, including impervious surface coverage.

### Building Permits

A building permit is required for most improvements such as the construction of a deck, installation of a shed over 200 square feet, installing in-ground swimming pools, finishing a basement, water heater changeouts, re-roof, re-siding, new windows, etc. Please contact the City for determination if a building permit is required prior to commencing any work.

### Administrative/Zoning Permits

For some improvements that do not require a building permit, an Administrative/Zoning Permit may be required. The purpose of an Administrative /Zoning Permit is to ensure the improvement complies with the City's zoning ordinance. Examples of improvements that require an Administrative/Zoning Permit include fences, sheds under 200 square feet, concrete or asphalt surfaces such as for patios or a parking stall off the side of a garage. A permit is required to be obtained prior to commencing any work.
