
Did You Know....

In 1912, forty local farmers decided to organize a dairy cooperative. By the time production began, sixty-two farmers had signed on and the creamery began producing butter and cheese. In the early days of the Norwood Creamery, cream was delivered by wagons filled with cream cans and pulled by horses. The cans made quite a racket upon delivery to the Creamery. In 1917, the Norwood Creamery built a larger modern brick creamery to serve the increasing needs of the dairy farmers.


Meanwhile in 1933, Oak Grove Dairy began operations in Scott County. In 1936, Oak Grove bought the Norwood Creamery and renamed it Oak Grove Dairy. It was used as a pasteurizing and bottling plant. Within a few years, Oak Grove Dairy was shipping only bottled milk. Wagons and horses were eventually replaced by bulk tank trucks delivering the milk to Oak Grove Dairy. During the 1950's to 1970's, Oak Grove grew larger and was remodeled with the latest dairy equipment.

Oak Grove Dairy closed its doors in 2004, but the historic site of the Norwood Creamery and Oak Grove Dairy lives on as the Oak Grove Center. You may have visited this building! It houses the Norwood Young America City Offices, Oak Grove Senior Residence, Carver County Sheriff's Office (hub), and Norwood Young America Library. You will also find the Community Gardens on the north side of the property.

NYA Snow Announcements

Ticket & Towing

The City will be once again enforcing its ticketing and towing of vehicles that are in violation of parking on city streets during a snow event which is the accumulation of two (2) or more inches of falling or blowing snow. Vehicles parked on a city street during a snow event will be ticketed, and if not moved within four (4) hours, towed. All fines for tickets are to be paid with the Carver County Court Administrator's Office. Vehicles that are towed will be towed to Smith Oil and Food Mart in Norwood Young America. Prior to getting their vehicle back, the vehicle owner will be required to pay all towing fees, show proof of vehicle ownership, proof of vehicle insurance, and a valid driver's license. The vehicle will also need to have up-to-date license and registration.

Designated Parking Areas

New for this snow season are designated parking areas for residents who do not have off-street parking available. Parking in the designated parking areas will be enforced from 2am-6am. The parking restrictions follow our city street parking ordinance as stated above (Ticket & Towing). The two designated parking spots within city limits are the north side of the Elm Street Municipal Parking Lot and the north side of Old City Hall/Food Shelf building. Watch for signs.

City Code "Parking"

Subd.1 Snowfall. "Snowfall" shall mean any accumulation of two or more inches of snow on a street when snow is falling or has fallen within the previous twenty-four hours.

Section 720.04 Restricted Parking During Snowfall and Blowing Snow. No person shall park or leave a motorized vehicle on any street within the City during or after a snowfall or a period of blowing snow until the snow has been removed from the street. Parking may be prohibited or restricted following snow removal as provided by City Code or State Law.

City Code "Sidewalks"

800.04 Removal of Snow Required. The owner of any lot or parcel of land within the City shall, within twenty-four (24) hours after a snow fall or otherwise accumulate upon any sidewalk designated by a resolution of the city Council as a part of the sidewalk thoroughfare program in front of or adjoining such lot or parcel of land, remove or cause the snow to be removed from the sidewalk.

If there's a fire hydrant near your house, help keep it accessible this winter:

DO YOUR PART SO THEY CAN DO THEIRS

3 ft.

CLEAR -AWAY ZONE
Remove any snow and ice
Clear a wide enough perimeter around the hydrant for firefighters to work (about 3 feet)
Clear a path from hydrant to street

SUMP PUMP REMINDER

Sump pumps may not be discharged into the storm sewers between November 1st and April 1st. Doing so results in dangerous ice conditions on the City streets. Should you need to discharge your sump pump during this time, please do so on your own property, away from City streets, alleys and sidewalks.

24 Hour Snow Removal Required for City Sidewalks

800.05 Removal of Snow by City; Assessment. In case the owner of any lot or parcel of land within the City shall fail to remove any snow that has fallen or otherwise accumulated upon any sidewalk as required by Subsection 800.04, it shall be the duty of the street commissioner of the City to cause the snow to be removed from the sidewalk at the expense of the owner and the expense incurred in the removal thereof may be recovered against the owner in a civil action, or be assessed upon the lot or parcel of land from in front of


City Code "Mail Receptacles"

Subd. 1. Mailboxes in the Public Right-of-way. H. The City shall not be responsible or liable for any damages to mail receptacles not in compliance with this ordinance or damages to mail receptacles from snow thrown or moved as a result of snow plowing.

Subd. 1. Mailboxes in the Public Right-of-way.

I. The City is not responsible for snow removal on or around the mail receptacles. It is the responsibility of each resident user of the mail receptacle to remove snow or other obstructions from around the mail receptacle.

Fibers (cardboard/paper products), plastic containers, metal and glass are acceptable recyclables. Please help keep the NYA Recycling Center clean so that NYA residents can continue to enjoy this service at no cost.

Junk Vehicles

Just a reminder that it is against City code to have junk vehicles on or around your property within public view for more than 48 hours. If you have such a vehicle, it will need to be stored inside a garage or screened from view by fencing or some other barrier approved by the City. The City is actively enforcing these violations pursuant to code: 730.03. If you have any questions, please contact us at City Hall at 952-777-0274 or you can visit our website to view the codes in more detail.

730.02 Declaration of Public Nuisance. Abandoned, junk, and unauthorized vehicles within the City shall be hereby found to create a public nuisance or blight condition tending to reduce the value of private property, to invite theft or vandalism, to create fire and other safety hazards, to attract vermin, and to constitute an unattractive nuisance creating a hazard to the health and safety of the public. The accumulation and outside storage of abandoned and junk vehicles shall be determined to be in the nature of rubbish, litter and unsightly debris, and a detriment to the environment, and shall be hereby declared to constitute a public nuisance which may be abated as provided in this Section or as provided under any other ordinance, specifically Section 600.06, of the City or by the laws of the State. (Amended by Ord. 168, 7/25/05)

730.03 Parking and Storage of Abandoned, Junk, and Unauthorized Vehicles Prohibited. No person shall park, store, or leave, or permit the parking, storing, or leaving of any abandoned or junk vehicle for a period in excess of 48 hours unless:

- A. the vehicle is completely within a building or is otherwise screened from view by fencing or other barrier approved by the City;
- B. the vehicle is stored or parked on private property in connection with a duly licensed or authorized commercial enterprise operated and conducted pursuant to law when such parking or storing of vehicles shall be necessary to the operation of the commercial enterprise.

In no case shall any vehicle be parked so as to constitute being an unauthorized vehicle.

Fall Leaves

Fall is leaf season and the trees are shedding their beautiful fall colors. Please know - we have a city compost site that is free to all NYA City residents for disposing of leaves and brush! Do not rake or blow leaves onto the streets - they will plug the stormwater drains which are crucial for handling the water runoff during rain events. The NYA Compost Site is located at 640 Tacoma Blvd and it is open from dawn to dusk seven days a week. This service is available to NYA City Residents ONLY. Thank you for keeping our city beautiful and keeping our stormwater drains clear!
