Fall Leaves

Fall is leaf season and the trees are shedding their beautiful fall colors. Please know - we have a city compost site that is free to all NYA City residents for disposing of leaves and brush! Do not rake or blow leaves onto the streets - they will plug the stormwater drains which are crucial for handling the water runoff during rain events. The NYA Compost Site is located at 640 Tacoma Blvd and it is open from dawn to dusk seven days a week. This service is available to NYA City Residents ONLY. Thank you for keeping our city beautiful and keeping our stormwater drains clear!

Weather Rules for Operation of Golf Carts/ATVs

City Code 750.08 Conditions of Operations: Operation of golf cars or Class 2 ATV on permitted streets within the City shall operate from sunrise to sunset between April 1 to November 1, except during periods of inclement weather or when visibility is impaired by weather, smoke, fog, or other conditions, or at any time when there is insufficient light to clearly see persons or vehicles on the roadway at a distance of 500 feet.

The City of Norwood Young America celebrated two expansion projects in the Tacoma West Industrial Park and Tacoma West Industrial Park Phase 2 on Thursday, November 7th. PVS Sackett Waconia, Inc. has started their 135,000 sf expansion project which will include an office expansion, new R&D center, additional fabrication space and truck flow. Director of Operations, Paul Peterson shared that the expansion will offer an additional 80-100 iobs in the next few years.

Nordic is comprised of two companies, Nordic Waste Management and Nordic Snow Management. The owners are Chris Pass and Joe Uran. Nordic Waste is a rapidly growing company that offers roll off dumpster rentals and waste solutions (no weekly curbside service) for both business and consumers. Nordic Snow is a long-established snow removal company that serves commercial and industrial clients. Nordic employs 8 full-time employees and 20 part time seasonal employees. Both companies are currently based out of Hopkins, MN and are looking forward to becoming part of the NYA community and all it has to offer.


