Truth in Taxation Overview

The Truth in Taxation public hearing was held on Monday, December 9th. This annual public hearing is an essential opportunity for the City to provide clarity on the budget process and discuss how your property taxes are allocated to support the community we all share.

A Breakdown of the City's Budget

The City's budget is carefully crafted to address both day-to-day operations and long-term infrastructure needs. It comprises four main components:

- General Fund This fund covers the majority of the City's operating expenses, including public safety, streets, parks and trails, buildings and grounds, and general operations. The General Fund is primarily supported by property taxes (66%), with additional contributions from state aid (21%), fees for services (9%), and interest earnings (4%).
- Capital Outlay/Equipment Fund Dedicated to purchasing large equipment and funding other capital projects, this fund relies entirely on property taxes.
- Debt Service This fund ensures the City meets its obligations for past projects, such as street reconstructions and building improvements. It is also funded entirely through property taxes.

Enterprise Funds This fund covers the City's water and sewer systems and handles everything from chemical treatments and testing to equipment maintenance and operational costs. Unlike the other funds, it is financed through utility and connection fees rather than property taxes.

The 2025 Property Tax Levy

For 2025, the City Council has approved a levy of \$3,997,104, representing an 8.58% increase. This decision reflects our commitment to balancing community needs with fiscal responsibility. Here is how the levy will be distributed:

- 53.11% General Government: Includes public safety, streets, parks and trails, and City operations.
- 22.46% Debt Service: Covers repayment of prior street and building projects.
- 24.43% Capital Outlay/Equipment: Funds new equipment and large-scale improvements.

Major Investments in 2025

This levy will enable several key projects aimed at enhancing the quality of life in Norwood Young America:

- 4th Avenue Area Reconstruction and Mill and Overlay Projects
- NYA Sports Complex, Prairie Dawn Park drainage improvements, Friendship Park Trail & Park Enhancements, including a dog park.
- New Tanker Truck and Encrypted Radios for the NYA Fire Department
- West Carver Community Pool House Improvements (grant and levy)
- Street Maintenance: Seal Coating, Crack Sealing, and Overlays

The City Council and staff are committed to transparency, stewardship, and delivering value for every dollar entrusted to us. The investments outlined above are designed to sustain and grow our community while maintaining the infrastructure and services that keep Norwood Young America a vibrant and thriving place to live.

Thank you for your continued engagement and support as we work together toward a strong and sustainable future.

Each license fee is \$5 and lasts through the calendar year. New licenses will be good from January 1st, 2025 to December 31st, 2025. Licenses can be purchased at City Hall. Weather Reminders

KEEP'EM CLEAR

If there's a fire hydrant near your house, help keep it accessible this winter:

Snow and Ice Policy Handbook

Norwood Young America winter parking regulations are effective from November 1st — April 1st every year, regardless if there is a snowfall. To view the City's <u>Snow and Ice Policy Handbook</u>, visit the City website at www.cityofnya.com.

Ticket & Towing

The City will once again be enforcing its ticketing and towing of vehicles that are in violation of parking on city streets during a snow event which is the accumulation of two (2) or more inches of falling or blowing snow. Per City Code Chapter 7: Traffic and Vehicles, violators failing to follow City Code will be ticketed and towed at the owners expense. All fines for tickets are to be paid with the Carver County Court Administrator's Office. Vehicles that are towed will be taken to Smith Oil and Food Mart in Norwood Young America. Prior to getting their vehicle back, the vehicle owner will be required to pay all towing fees, show proof of vehicle ownership, proof of vehicle insurance, and a valid driver's license. The vehicle will also need to an have up-to-date license and registration.

Designated Parking Areas

There are designated parking areas for residents who do not have off-street parking available during snow emergencies. Parking in the designated parking areas will be enforced from 2am-6am. The parking restrictions follow our city street parking ordinance as stated above (Ticket & Towing). The two designated parking areas within city limits are the north side of the Elm Street Municipal Parking Lot and the north side of Old City Hall/Food Shelf building. Watch for signs.

Sump Pump Reminders

Sump pumps may not be discharged into the storm sewers between November 1st and April 1st. Doing so results in dangerous ice conditions on the City streets. Should you need to discharge your sump pump during this time, discharge into your residential sewer or onto your own property, away from City streets, alleys and sidewalks.

South Park Hockey Rink

The ice rink has been flooded and is ready for use! Skaters are welcome to use the rink if ice conditions are favorable.
