RE: Transient Merchant Application – Firemans Barbeque

The City of Norwood Young America has received a Transient Merchant application from Justin Spande for Firemans Barbeque. The food truck serves Barbeque foods and sides. Their location is either approved by the property owner ahead of time or they attend events they have been asked to participate in.

Chapter 3 of the City Code states the following:

Transient Merchant. The term "transient merchant" shall mean a person who temporarily sets up business out of a vehicle, trailer, boxcar, tent, other portable shelter, or empty store front for the purpose of exposing or displaying for sale, selling, or attempting to sell, and delivering, goods, wares, products, merchandise, or other personal property, and who does not remain or intend to remain in any one location for more than one hundred twenty (120) consecutive days.

RECOMMENDATION:

A motion to approve the Transient Merchant Application from Justin Spande, doing business as Firemans Barbeque, and not to exceed 120 consecutive days at any one location as listed in Chapter 3, Section 310 of the City Code.

Grant Application

The City submitted a MN DEED Small Cities Streetscape Grant application in November 2024 to support the Historic Downtown Young America Beautification Project which is planned for 2026 in conjunction with the Carver County mill and overlay project of County Road 34.

The Historic Downtown Young America Beautification Project is a key initiative aimed at revitalizing the downtown area, improving infrastructure, and fostering a welcoming environment for residents, businesses, and visitors. The Project is expected to:

- Improve the visual appeal and functionality of downtown spaces through streetscaping and pedestrian-friendly infrastructure.
- Increase property values and attract new businesses, fostering economic growth.
- Enhance the overall quality of life for residents by creating an inviting and well-maintained downtown area.
- Align with the City's broader objectives of promoting affordable housing and community development, consistent with the mission of the Carver County CDA.

The City's portion of the project will include partial road reconstruction and beautification efforts, including new sidewalks, streetlights, trees, garbage receptacles, benches, and flowerpots.

Staff received notice from MN DEED on February 6, 2025, that the City's application made it through the preliminary round of proposals. 36 out of 42 proposals were determined to be either competitive or marginally competitive, totaling \$25.5 million. The projected amount for grant dollars this cycle is \$16-\$18 million. The City of NYA application requested \$600,000 of support, and the proposal was determined marginally competitive.

As part of the next steps of submitting the full application, the City must determine that the LMI (low or moderate income) is at least 51% OR proceed with a slum and blight designation of the project area. Norwood Young America's LMI (low or moderate income) is less than the minimum, so a slum and blight analysis is necessary to proceed. The following conditions must be identified to qualify for this determination:

1) Public Improvements are in a general state of deterioration; or

2) At least 25% of the buildings are deteriorated or deteriorating and have at least one of the following characteristics: Physical deterioration of building or improvement; Abandonment of property; Chronic high turnover or vacancy rate; Significant decline in property value or abnormally low property value in relation to other areas of the community; or Known or suspected environmental contamination.

Staff is requesting to apply for a Carver County CDA Community Growth Partnership Initiative Predevelopment Grant in the amount of up to \$10,000 to assist in funding a slum and blight analysis for the Historic Downtown Young America Main Street Streetscape Project area. This predevelopment grant is a 1-to-1 match.

This project aligns with the goals and criteria of the CDA's Community Growth Partnership Initiative Predevelopment Grant Program, which supports projects that enhance economic and community development.

The full MN DEED Small Cities Streetscape Application is due April 16, 2025.

Background

The NYA Economic Development Authority's purpose and core functions are to remain consistent with general economic development purposes and functions and to have the capability, as approved by the City Council, to issue bonds and levy special benefit taxes to pay or finance public redevelopment.

EDA Purpose:

- Recruitment of new business and industry
- Retention and expansion of existing businesses and industry
- Diversification of the community's economy
- Retention and creation of jobs with livable wages
- Increasing community tax base
- Planning and coordination of economic development resources and efforts

Core functions:

- Organizational development efforts focus on maintaining and enhancing the capacity of the EDA organization.
- Market development efforts are outreach actions.
- Infrastructure development activities that strive to "set the table" for economic development.
- Business development activities are strategies implemented to retain and attract business.

The NYA EDC will use the following structure to maintain oversight and ensure diverse community representation:

- **Board Composition**: The EDA will comprise seven members, combining City Council representatives and local stakeholders.
 - o Two City Council Members: Serving annual terms within their elected office.
 - Five Community Stakeholders: Selected from local business sectors such as banking, real estate, and business management. The term will be three years, with

- a four-term limit. Candidates will be selected through an application and interview process to ensure committed, qualified representatives.
- Executive Roles: The City Administrator would serve as the EDA's Executive Director (ad hoc), ensuring consistent guidance at the executive level. The Community & Economic Development Director would also function as the city liaison (ad hoc) to strengthen city coordination and serve as the Authority's secretary.
- Meeting Schedule: EDA meetings will be held at City Hall on the 2nd Monday of each month at 4:30 p.m., in line with council work sessions scheduled for the 4th Monday of each month.

Applications for EDA board positions were sent out to seven interested stakeholders in the NYA community. Five individuals submitted applications. The administrative staff is recommending the appointment of the following five committed and qualified stakeholders:

- Serves on the NYA Area Chamber of Commerce Board
- Experience with successful marketing and community collaboration

Friendship Park Tennis Court Rehab Project

The rehabilitation of the Friendship Park tennis courts has been included in the City's CIP for the year 2026 (\$95,000). The VFW and America Legion civic organizations have recently approached the City looking for a large park project to financially support. Because of this offer, the NYA Parks & Recreation Commission is recommending that this project be pursued for 2025; however, the project's completion in 2025 will be contingent upon donations. Should the project not get fully funded, it will be completed in 2026 as part of the CIP budget.

Attached is an aerial view of the tennis courts. The entire area is ~14,400 sf with two entrances on the southwest and northeast sides. Parks & Recreation commissioners discussed the current amenities of the court - 2 tennis courts, 2 pickleball courts painted within the tennis courts (and using the same nets), and 2 basketball hoops with no striping. The consensus was to seek bids for the following amenities:

- Complete mill and overlay of the court with a sport court finish
- One (1) tennis court, which will include the striping for one (1) pickleball court
- 4-5 pickleball courts and nets, number of courts depending on design
- 2 basketball hoops with half basketball court striping

Pending Council approval, staff will pursue two quotes for the project and will contact the civic organizations to inform them of the status.

As a reminder, the Friendship Park Trail will be completely redone in 2025, with an extension to the tennis courts. A new dog park will also be planned in this same vicinity.



RE: City Property Event Request—Lion's Club

The Lion's Club recently requested to bring in a private company Circus event on City property in the new industrial park. In doing some research on the last time a circus was in Norwood Young America, staff found that 625 Railroad Drive was the area used for the Circus and referred to as "Metro West Industrial Park"; however, it was not. It was private property, not City property and not in the industrial park.

Minnesota Statute Section 116.07 requires that municipalities exercise prudence in allowing activities on City property, especially those with a high probability of accidents and potential liability claims. Although the circus operator has secured comprehensive insurance, this coverage does not negate the inherent risks associated with operating a high-risk entertainment venture on one of our City's key assets.

Allowing an operation on City property with unpredictable and elevated risk factors would not only conflict with these objectives but could also expose the City—and, by extension, our taxpayers—to significant liability. As stewards of public property, our legal and ethical duty is to limit activities that may expose our City to liability.

The City of Norwood Young America values the Lion's Club's commitment to enriching local life and community events.
