Warmer temperatures and fresh breezes bring the perfect opportunity for residents to take action by cleaning up their yards, refreshing their properties, and helping to keep Norwood Young America a beautiful place to live, work, and play.

To support these efforts, the NYA Clean Up Day is scheduled for Saturday, April 26th, providing city residents (please bring ID for proof of residency) with a convenient way to dispose of household clutter and yard blight. This event is a great opportunity to clear out unwanted items responsibly and give your property a fresh start.



In conjunction with the NYA Clean Up Day (always set for the 4th Saturday of April), the NYA City-Wide Garage Sales will be held April 16th-19th. This is the perfect time to sort through basements, garages, and closets—sell items you no longer need, donate them to a worthy cause, or dispose of any remaining clutter during Clean Up Day. This combined effort helps reduce waste while giving residents a chance to find new treasures or clear space at home.

To further assist residents with yard maintenance, the NYA Compost Site at 640 Tacoma Blvd will open for the season on April 2nd. New hours of operation will be Wednesdays from 3:00 PM - 6:00 PM and Saturdays from 8:00 AM - Noon. IDs will be checked upon entry to ensure the site is used by NYA residents only. If traffic and demand exceed expectations, adjustments to the hours will be considered. The compost site is an excellent way to properly dispose of leaves, grass clippings, and other yard waste.

Let's take pride in our community by embracing this season of renewal. A cleaner, more vibrant Norwood Young America benefits everyone, and with exciting projects, community initiatives, and opportunities to come together on the horizon—let's make the most of this season of fresh starts!

Last Chance to Contribute!

Old Town is not only a public facility that is used for community events, but also iconic to Willkommen Memorial Park, home of the Young America Cardinals, and of course, Norwood Young America's annual Stiftungsfest celebration!

Old Town was constructed in 1990-1991 by a group of community members who wanted to beautify Willkommen Memorial Park by building a structure to resemble historic buildings from the now former Young America, MN. When restoration became necessary, the City desired to maintain the integrity of the historical design of the buildings. In the fall of 2023, construction began, and the "New" Old Town has been completed since summer 2024.

Spring Has Sprung! Spring Reminders & Clean Up Info

Don't Forget!

Renew Your Animal License — Must be renewed beginning of each year (dogs & cats). A copy of the vaccination records is needed.

Renew Your ATV/Golf Cart Permit — Must be renewed beginning of each year. A copy of vehicle insurance is needed. Beginning April 1st, these can be driven around town with a permit.

Community Garden Sign-Up — To renew your community garden plot from last year, contact City Hall or stop in. <u>Previous plot owners have until March 31st</u> to reclaim their plot for 2025. If you did not have a garden last year but would like one, call City Hall to get on the waitlist.



Lawn Regulations — Spring is around the corner and it won't be long before we will trade the snowblowers for the lawn mowers. Remember to keep your lawns mowed and weeds under control so you are not in violation of city code.

Parking Regulations — Per city code, four (4) vehicles are allowed on your property. Any more, you need to apply for a temporary permit. Street parking has a 48 hour window before you are in violation.

Renovation Permits — Reminder, if you are updating or renovating your home, you will need to apply for a building permit prior to starting. Sump Pump Regulations — All sump pumps must be day-lighted into your yard or into the storm sewer— not into your neighbors yard or a public sidewalk. Sump pumps should also not be connected into a sanitary sewer drain! Doing so results in the treatment of unnecessary amounts of water, putting additional strain on the treatment system and raising prices for everyone.

Spring Clean Up — Take advantage of the City Wide Garage Sale on April 16-19th, and the Spring Clean-Up on April 26th to get rid of unwanted items. Don't forget about the garage & outside of your house too! Blight can become a problem within the city and this is the perfect time to get your property cleaned up.

Utility Reminders

Sewer charges reset with the January water bill and are averaged out based on January, February, and March water usage.

930.01 Sewer Charges. Sewer charges shall be as set in the fee schedule adopted by the Council. The sewer charges for residential and commercial users shall be calculated from the volume of metered water used. The per month billable flow shall be based on the average of the winter quarter (January, February, March) actual water used. (Amended by Ord. 217, 11-23-2009)

Utility bills are mailed out by the 15th of the month, though we do try to get them out by the 10th of the month.

930.05 Payment Dates. Owners shall be billed monthly on or about the 15th day of the month. The amounts duly billed shall be payable on or before the last day in the month of billing or such amounts shall become delinquent. (Amended by Ord. 217, 11-23-2009)

Administrative Zoning Permits — Fences

Orderly growth and construction are essential for maintaining the character, safety, and functionality of a community. By ensuring that all structures, including fences, are built according to established regulations, cities can prevent conflicts between property owners and maintain an aesthetically pleasing environment. Proper permitting helps guide development, balancing the needs of individual property owners with the broader goals of the community.

City Code 1245.05 Fences

Administrative and zoning permits are required for the construction of fences within city limits. No fence, except temporary fencing, shall be constructed without an administrative permit. Additionally, a fence that is eight (8) feet in height or greater will require a building permit. When submitting a permit application, the applicant must include a plot plan that clearly describes the type, location, and method of anchoring the proposed fence. This ensures that all construction complies with local regulations and zoning codes.

Boundary line fences can be constructed up to the property line, but no part of the fence may extend beyond it. To obtain a fence permit, city staff requires the applicant to provide proof of property boundaries. This can be done by submitting a certificate of survey from a registered land surveyor or by showing accurate stake markers of the surveyed lot. For additional detailed information, please contact staff at City Hall.

Administrative/Zoning Permits can be downloaded off the City's website or picked up at City Hall.

Please — Clean Up After Your Pet!

Please remember to pick up after your pets this spring. Pet waste can harm water quality and human health, making it a major cause of pollution in urban areas.



The Environmental Protection Agency classifies dog waste as a pollutant. Dogs' diets are high in nitrogen and phosphorus, which

can damage plant roots and cause algae blooms in water systems. This can suffocate aquatic life and make our lakes and ponds unhealthy. Pet waste can also carry harmful germs and parasites like E. coli and Salmonella, as well as antibiotic-resistant bacteria, posing serious health risks. If left behind, pet waste washes into storm drains during rain and goes directly into our waterways without treatment.

Please take a moment to clean up after your pet, whether on a walk or in your backyard!
